

Ideas for Productive and Fun Club Activities and Providing a Useful Service to Our Community

During our last DETR Board Meeting, a heartfelt thank you note to our president, Jon Stevens, precipitated a good discussion. The note was from Earline Shipley and family thanking us for bringing our antique cars to Billy Joe's cemetery service. We also recently brought our antique cars to Tom McGrath's funeral service. Furthermore, Roger Baker has formally requested that our club members attend his funeral when it occurs (fortunately for Roger there is no set date looming in the foreseeable future! He was just planning ahead—something that we all should think about).

I recently joined the Professional Car Society (PCS), which is composed of owners and enthusiasts interested in hearses, ambulances, and big formal limousines. There seems to be a club for every kind of vehicle! After perusing several issues of the PCS newsletters it became evident that these vehicles were used quite regularly at their members' funerals and at the funerals of non members also. There appears to be a trend where both young and mature people alike are seeking to have antique cars at their weddings or funerals, rather than hiring newer, more formal limousines.

Some years ago, the Nacogdoches Antique Automobile Club, which was the direct ancestor of the DETR club, held meetings in which our members helped other to assemble and repair their cars. Up to as recently as a year ago, a number of us have, on occasion, met at the garages of Robert Stanaland, Jim Thrall, or Wendall Spreadbury for the same purpose. Over the years, a number of our members have come to my house and helped me put my LN 33 Duesenbury together. We also went to Stanely Jones' garage and worked on several different cars and trucks. I know that at those events I always learned something new about the cars and I know that we always had a good time!

Perhaps we could start that fun activity again and have even more satisfaction in that not only would we have fun being together and learning more about our antique cars, we could also provide a meaningful service to our members and the community.

Something that would address all of the above is that I happen to have a formal, really-big, 160 inch wheel-base, special non-assembly-line bodied 1939 Packard Henny Hearse that is in unrestored condition but untouched/modified condition and very complete. I can supply the vehicle, all of the parts, materials, tools, and a place to work on it.

Perhaps during the Saturday October 25, 2008 DETR meeting/event that is scheduled in San Augustine, we could have some discussion about this activity.
